The Dreadnought - a clipper built at Newburyport, Massachusetts in 1853. She made very fast time between New York and Liverpool for the **Red Cross Line** and went down while doubling Cape Horn, 1869.

Notes on the words

Liverpool packet - in this case, Yankee a packet ship trading with Liverpool.

Let her go - packet ships were proud of their speed.

The Rock Light - Perch Rock Lighthouse since 1683, replaced by the New Brighton Lighthouse in 1827. Off Rock Point at the entrance to the Mersey

Red Cross to show - show the flag of the Red Cross Line. Packet lines were very competitive.

Swallowtail and Blackball - other companies that run packet ship - competitors of Red Cross!
