**Trawl** - A sturdy bag or net that can be dragged along the bottom, or towed at various depths above the bottom, to catch fish.

Capstan - the capstan could be used to pull any line, not just the anchor cable.

Sou'wester - collapsible, wide-brimmed, oilskin rainhat
